### 1) Review of 2009

Gary provided the committee with a summary of the status of projects we were successful in obtaining funding for as well as the other capital projects completed. The department had a busy year in 2009 with a number of these projects seeing completion in 2010.

### 2) Riverbank Erosion

Garth Noecker from K Smart, obtained two quotes to complete the engineering to address the erosion at two locations of Four Mile Creek at Conc #4/SDRD #10. Parish Geomorphic quoted \$9,500 + expenses and Water's Edge Environmental Solutions Team quoted \$10,700 + expenses to complete both locations. There will also be an additional cost of approx \$3,000 to complete the topographic base plan survey which will be completed by K Smart. Garth recommends proceeding with Parish Geomorphic and that we need to allow for some contingency for budget purposes. We are including \$16,000 in the 2010 budget to complete the engineering so the work can be completed in 2011. The committee agreed with K Smart's recommendation.

### 3) Bridge/Culvert Inspections

K Smart and Associates completed the bridge and culvert inspections in the Fall of 2009. Gary presented the summary of their inspection reports for the committee to review. Although overall our bridges are in reasonable shape, K Smart estimates that we would need to spend in excess of a million dollars over the next 5 years to address the deficiencies that have been identified to be done during that period. BM Ross completed the inspection of the two Connecting Link bridges and we have applied for Connecting Link Funding for rehab work to the steel structure of the Highway #6 Bridge. The inspection disclosed substantial deterioration since the last inspection in 2007. Due to other bridge projects, the MTO is not prepared to rehab the bridge this year and have requested a detailed assessment to assist them in determining when the rehab work will be done. This assessment will be done by BM Ross this Spring and the 2010 proposed budget has been adjusted accordingly.

### 4) Foreman Report (see attached)

### 5) Street Light Response

Gary reported that Wellington North Power had requested direction regarding responding to street light requests. These requests usually come from the general public and/or the Police regarding lights that are not working. When these requests come on week-ends or outside normal working hours there is an overtime cost to respond. The committee agreed that WNP does not need to respond to these requests until the next normal working day. The exception would obviously be signal light repairs which must be responded to right away.

### 6) Other Business

- Bridge #20 was hit on Sdrd #7 West. There was a temporary repair made and we are in contact with the person that hit the bridge to recover damages. The bridge will need substantial repairs next summer
- Accessibility training was completed by staff in December
- Committee reviewed information for the Public Meeting regarding the proposed Arthur Works Yard development. The meeting will be held on February 25<sup>th</sup> at the Arthur arena at 7pm.

#### **Economic Stimulus Funding:**

### Agri-Tourism

Opportunities will be explored to celebrate Wellington North's rich agricultural heritage and rural traditions. Working with the local agricultural community and their retailers in the region, the objective will be to expand and promote agritourism opportunities. In addition to attracting visiting merchants, initiatives will include a shop / invest locally component. Specific target markets will include Day-trippers within a 2hr drive radius of WN, Outdoor Enthusiasts, Shop-Local Markets and Residents, Bus Tour Market. Potential Components include: Farmer's Market, "WN Made" Brand (similar to Made on Manitoulin), Fall Fairs (existing, expansion), Farm Tours (existing, expansion), Bus Tours (existing, expansion) and Community Corn Roasts, etc. Agri-tourism opportunities expanding out of the current Culinary Tourism initiatives will be explored and capitalized upon.

### **Country Christmas**

To celebrate the local Christmas experience to visitors and stopping tourists as well as encourage shopping local to residents, and working in conjunction with local chambers, BIAs, business owners, retailers and service orgs. Potential Components include: Midnight Madness Shopping Event, Tree Lighting Ceremonies (existing), 2 Evening Christmas Parades (existing), Christmas Concert, Play (revenue from ticket sales), In-store celebrations and promotions, Christmas Craft & Bake Sale (revenue of sales), B&B and Farm Accommodations, Tree Sales, Decorated House Tour, Carol Singers, Holiday Lights, Gingerbread House Build, Decorate (contest / event).

#### Winter Festival

To expand on year-round seasonality of activities and the success of the Olympic Torch Celebrations, a family-friendly Winter Festival could be held on February's Family Day and include components such as sampling, snow-sculptures, snow obstacle course, free-skates, moon-walks, trail-walks, snow-man building competition, etc.

### 5. POST IMPLEMENTATION REVIEW OF OLYMPIC TORCH CELEBRATIONS

Donna provided a review of the Olympic Torch Relay Community Celebrations held on December 28<sup>th</sup>, 2009. The historic day was a great success with thousands of people lining the streets of downtown Mount Forest to cheer on the Torch Bearers. With the assistance of numerous volunteers, over 2,500 Olympic and Canada hand-flags were distributed along the route along with coupons for FREE Hot Chocolate at the Sports Complex following the Relay.

Community celebrations at the Mount Forest & District Sports Complex were also well attended by both local residents and visitors from Clifford, Dundalk, Durham, Fergus, Elora, Harriston, Holstein, K/W, Palmerston, Moorefield, Sudbury, Hamilton, LaSalle, Listowel, Fordwich and Etobicoke. 174 Hot Chocolate coupons were redeemed.

Over a dozen local sports groups and organizations participated in the celebration of sport in Wellington North including displays and on-ice demonstrations. Media coverage of the entire event was extensive with all local media organizations having pictures and editorials online within two days and extensive print coverage in the weekly newspapers. Donna also thanked John Braby for his contributions to the day's events by attending in his Torch Bearer uniform and posing for pictures with his Olympic Torch for anyone who asked. Donna also thanked all volunteers for their participation as the event would not have been possible without their assistance.

### **BY-LAW NUMBER 15-10**

BEING A BY-LAW TO CONFIRM THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WELLINGTON NORTH AT ITS REGULAR MEETING HELD ON FEBRUARY 8, 2010.

AUTHORITY: Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Sections 5(3) and 130.

**WHEREAS** the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Section 5(3), provides that the jurisdiction of every council is confined to the municipality that it represents and its powers shall be exercised by by-law.

**AND WHEREAS** the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, Section 130 provides that every council may pass such by-laws and make such regulations for the health, safety and well-being of the inhabitants of the municipality in matters not specifically provided for by this Act and for governing the conduct of its members as may be deemed expedient and are not contrary to law.

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of The Corporation of the Township of Wellington North hereby **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:** 

- 1. That the action of the Council at its Regular Meeting held on February 8, 2010 in respect to each report, motion, resolution or other action passed and taken by the Council at its meeting, is hereby adopted, ratified and confirmed, as if each resolution or other action was adopted, ratified and confirmed by separate by-law.
- That the Mayor and the proper officers of the Township are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to the said action, or to obtain approvals where required, and, except where otherwise provided, the Mayor and the Clerk are hereby directed to execute all documents necessary in that behalf and to affix the corporate seal of the Township to all such documents.
- 3. That this by-law, to the extent to which it provides authority for or constitutes the exercise by the Council of its power to proceed with, or to provide any money for, any undertaking work, project, scheme, act, matter or thing referred to in subsection 65 (1) of the <a href="Ontario Municipal Board Act,">Ontario Municipal Board Act,</a>, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.28, shall not take effect until the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board with respect thereto, required under such subsection, has been obtained.
- 4. That any acquisition or purchase of land or of an interest in land pursuant to this by-law or pursuant to an option or agreement authorized by this by-law, is conditional on compliance with <a href="Environmental Assessment Act">Environmental Assessment Act</a>, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter E.18.
